## KET (A2)

Paper	Content	Marks (% of total)	Purpose
<b>Reading and Writing</b> (1 hour 10 minutes) <a href="#">See sample paper</a>	9 parts/ 56 questions	50%	Shows you can understand simple written information such as signs, brochures, newspapers and magazines.
<b>Listening</b> (30 minutes, including 8 minutes' transfer time) <a href="#">See sample paper</a>	5 parts/ 25 questions	25%	Requires you to be able to understand announcements and other spoken material when people speak reasonably slowly.
<b>Speaking</b> (8–10 minutes per pair of candidates) <a href="#">See sample paper</a>	2 parts	25%	Shows you can take part in a conversation by answering and asking simple questions. Your Speaking test will be conducted face to face with one or two other candidates and two examiners. This makes your test more realistic and more reliable.

Paper	Content	Marks (% of total)	Purpose
<b>Reading and Writing</b> (1 hour 30 minutes) <a href="#">See sample paper</a>	Reading: <b>5 parts/</b> <b>35 questions</b>  Writing: <b>3 parts/</b> <b>7 questions</b>	50%	Shows you can read and understand the main points from signs, newspapers and magazines, and can use vocabulary and structure correctly.
<b>Listening</b> (36 minutes, including 6 minutes' transfer time) <a href="#">See sample paper</a>	<b>4 parts/</b> <b>25 questions</b>	25%	You have to be able to follow and understand a range of spoken materials including announcements and discussions about everyday life.
<b>Speaking</b> (10–12 minutes per pair of candidates) <a href="#">See sample paper</a>	<b>4 parts</b>	25%	Shows how good your spoken English is as you take part in conversation by asking/answering questions and talking, for example, about your likes and dislikes. Your Speaking test will be conducted face to face with one or two other candidates and two examiners. This makes your test more realistic and more reliable.



## FCE (B2)

Paper	Content	Marks (% of total)	Purpose
<b>Reading and Use of English</b> (1 hour 15 minutes) <a href="#">See sample paper</a>	7 parts/52 questions	40%	Shows you can deal confidently with different types of text, such as fiction, newspapers and magazines. Tests your use of English with tasks that show how well you can control your grammar and vocabulary.
<b>Writing</b> (1 hour 20 minutes) <a href="#">See sample paper</a>	2 parts	20%	Requires you to be able to produce two different pieces of writing, such as letters, reports, reviews and essays.
<b>Listening</b> (about 40 minutes) <a href="#">See sample paper</a>	4 parts/30 questions	20%	Requires you to be able to follow and understand a range of spoken materials, such as news programmes, presentations and everyday conversations.
<b>Speaking</b> (14 minutes per pair of candidates) <a href="#">See sample paper</a>	4 parts	20%	Tests your ability to communicate effectively in face to face situations. You will take the Speaking test with one or two other candidates.



## CAE (C1)

Paper	Content	Marks (% of total)	Purpose
<b>Reading and Use of English</b> (1 hour 30 minutes)  <a href="#">See sample paper</a>	<b>8 parts/</b> <b>56 questions</b>	40%	Shows you can deal confidently with different types of text, such as fiction, newspapers and magazines. Tests your use of English with different types of exercise that show how well you can control your grammar and vocabulary.
<b>Writing</b> (1 hour 30 minutes)  <a href="#">See sample paper</a>	<b>2 parts</b>	20%	You create two different pieces of writing, such as essays, letters/emails, proposals, reports and reviews.
<b>Listening</b> (about 40 minutes)  <a href="#">See sample paper</a>	<b>4 parts/30 questions</b>	20%	Tests your ability to follow and understand a range of spoken materials, such as interviews, radio broadcasts, presentations, talks and everyday conversations
<b>Speaking</b> (15 minutes per pair of candidates)  <a href="#">See sample paper</a>	<b>4 parts</b>	20%	Tests your ability to communicate effectively in face-to-face situations. You will take the Speaking test with another candidate.




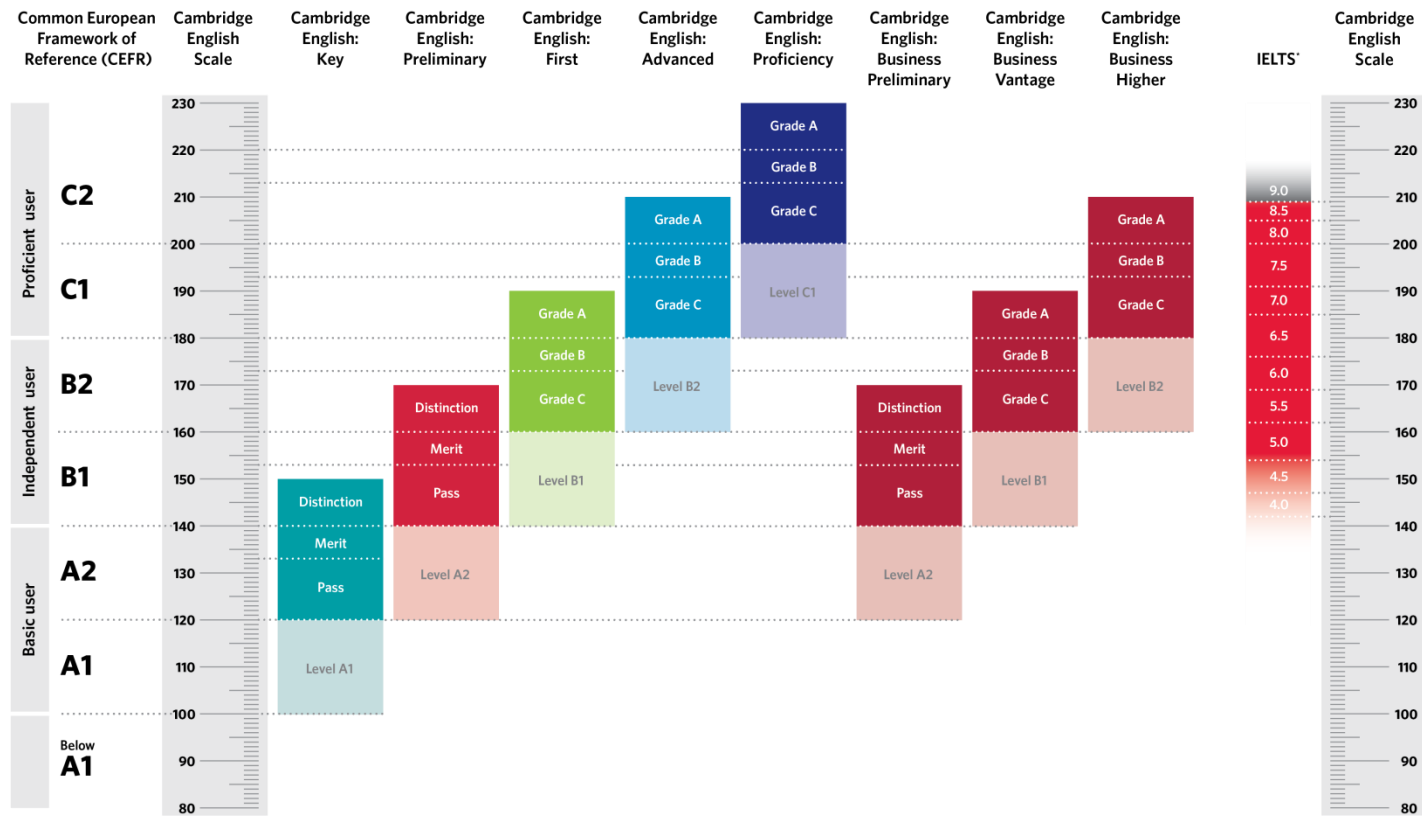
**COMUNICACIÓN DE LOS RESULTADOS:**

La **Cambridge English Scale** consiste en una variedad de puntuaciones utilizadas para comunicar los resultados de los exámenes Cambridge English. Esta nueva escala se basa en nuestro vigente sistema de comunicación de resultados y en años de investigación. Está diseñada para complementar al **Marco Común Europeo de Referencia (MCER)**.

La **Cambridge English Scale** permite comunicar los resultados de todos nuestros exámenes de una forma más sencilla y satisface mejor las necesidades de los usuarios de nuestros exámenes, incluyendo candidatos, profesores, universidades y servicios de inmigración.

Resultados más detallados - los candidatos recibirán una puntuación por cada una de las habilidades lingüísticas (comprensión lectora, expresión escrita, comprensión auditiva y expresión oral) más otra por el uso del inglés. También recibirán una puntuación global por el examen en su totalidad en la **Cambridge English Scale**.
